We have enjoyed another busy week at school, starting with individual photographs. It was disappointing to not be able to offer the facility for sibling photographs to be taken in the school day but Government Guidance outlines the actions we are to take within school to minimise the risk of transmission of COVID-10 where it stipulates the following:

Schools must comply with health and safety law, which requires them to assess risks and put in place proportionate control measures. Schools should thoroughly review their health and safety risk assessments and plans for the autumn term that address the risks identified using the [system of controls](#). These are an adapted form of the system of protective measures that will be familiar from the summer term. Essential measures include:

- a requirement that people who are ill stay at home
- robust hand and respiratory hygiene
- enhanced cleaning and ventilation arrangements
- active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- formal consideration of how to reduce contacts and maximise distancing between those in school wherever possible and minimise the potential for contamination so far as is reasonably practicable

How contacts are reduced will depend on the school's circumstances and will (as much as possible) include:

- grouping children together
- avoiding contact between groups

- arranging classrooms with forward facing desks
- staff maintaining distance from pupils and other staff as much as possible
