On Tuesday we would like our Year 6 pupils to stay until 17:30 for a film night with popcorn and treats. Thursday we are able to continue with our BBQ. The Year 5 and 6's are invited to come to school in their own clothes on this day with the Friday spent celebrating their time at Carleton Green along with a quiz.

I have received some lovely letters from our Year 5 children that aspire to be our next Head Boy and Girl. Those that have been shortlisted will have received a letter to invite them to produce a presentation for the children in school. This presentation will have to be recorded and emailed to me to then show classes for the children to place their votes. The deadline for these is Tuesday 20th so that the classes can view them on the Wednesday. I am incredibly proud of all the children that have taken the time to apply and am very much looking forward to seeing the presentations to the school. Our current Year Five are as delightful as our Year Six cohort and I already have several children highlighted for prefect roles for the coming year. These roles are assigned to pupils as a way of our acknowledging their positive attitudes towards school life. The accolade attached to being selected for a role of responsibility in the final year of Primary School is far reaching and one to be very proud of.



We have awarded our first ever Gold Carleton Code to a Year Four pupil this week! Finlay is a very new member of our school and has settled into life here with ease. He showed true compassion and consideration towards a fellow classmate during their sports day – quietly allowing someone else to win. The understated act of kindness blew away the teachers!
