Remembrance Sunday is a national opportunity to remember the service and sacrifice of all those that have defended our freedoms and protected our way of life. We remember the Armed Forces, and their families, from Britain and the Commonwealth, the vital role played by the emergency services and those who have lost their lives as a result of conflict or terrorism.



Some time ago, whilst out walking their dog; two sisters Katie and Elsie, discovered a section of Polish graves in Carleton Crematory. They found that a large proportion were of ex servicemen who had served in World War Two. Mostly in the RAF and Polish Air Force, some in the Battle of Britain and some in the famous 303 Squadron.

When they got home, they did some research online and found a man in Warsaw, Poland was trying to catalogue the locations of the graves of all Polish ex servicemen. They contacted him and subsequently sent him pictures of each headstone for his records.

This year, the man, made contact and asked if he sent poppies, would we be able to place one on each grave, to mark Polish Independence Day and U.K. & Commonwealth Remembrance Day?

Katie and Elsie were very keen to help and we returned on a cold, wet November late afternoon with two boxes of long stemmed, silk poppies. The girls located each of the relevant graves (26 in total), by reading the inscriptions, and placed a poppy by each of them.

The remaining four, they placed on a memorial cross where several other Polish servicemen's names are inscribed.

The Pumpkin event at the end of term was successfully supported by many families with some great carving skills emailed over to Mrs Hicks. Winners are: Georgia from EYFS, Florence M in KS1, Abigail N in LKS2 and Oscar H in UKS2. *Well done*!
