This has been yet another incredibly busy week. Our Year 6 parents have recently met to talk through the arrangements for SATs. Although it is important for our children to all work as hard as they can to achieve their very best, we do not want your children to feel pressured or worried about the tests. We have some families that have made considerable effort since Christmas to improve their child's attendance and already this has noticeably impacted on their child's attainment in their learning. https://www.gov.uk :There is a clear link between poor attendance at school and lower academic achievement. Of pupils who miss more than 50 per cent of school only three per cent manage to achieve five or more GCSEs at grades A* to C including Maths and English. 73 per cent of pupils who have over 95 per cent attendance achieve five or more GCSEs at grades A* to C.

They were excited to hear about our vision for our school and how the possibility of extending our hall will enable us to achieve all we aspire for our children. They are coming in again today to photograph the vast range of activities we run for 'Fun Friday'. Therefore I cannot fail to be upset by the comments seen on Facebook made by parents of children from this school. We ask in our home/school agreements that as parents of children at our school, you support us and respect the hard

work we put in to best meet the needs of each individual. I totally understand that over the seven years, you will have times where you may feel aggrieved however, Facebook and other social media sites are not the best forum to vocalise your concerns or queries. Every decision that is made for our school is always made with the children as our priority. As mentioned in our newsletters way back in September we are continually striving to move our school forwards to become truly outstanding. Developments in our school curriculum and environment are designed to promote high standards whilst ensuring the children are safe, happy and enjoy school life. The trips and events that will take place throughout your child's seven years here at Carleton Green are to enhance the teaching and learning that are taking place.

We have a rolling programme planned for classrooms to be redecorated and refurbished with technology updates and along with these plans it has been our intention to refurbish and extend our heart space (school hall) to meet the needs of our growing school. We have thirty five more pupils attending school than we did just three years ago along with wanting to involve Little chicks more.

This much wished-for development for our school has been something that has been shared with all at Carleton Green in either earlier newsletters, PTFA meetings and during many family assemblies. We all will feel the benefit of this should it successfully go ahead. Occasions such as productions, celebration and class assemblies will feel less crowded. There will be storage provided for Sports equipment along with an improved sound system to support PTFA events. Areas already existing within school that will be absorbed to accommodate the new hall space will be extended onto the outside, in line with our current building line, so that not only will we gain in hall space but we will gain by having a larger learning space with disabled toilet facilities that will be used during the school day for our invaluable Nest (our Nurture Room) and can be also used for our breakfast club and afterschool club. As a community school I believe we should be able to offer the local community the use of our amazing facilities beyond our school day and the planned work will enable us to achieve this. These plans are now with the school planning team at Lancashire County Council and we are excitedly awaiting further information as to whether these plans can go ahead and when.

We also want to develop our outdoor facilities over the next few years and have had several companies come and look at our existing provision and our desired provision (wish list). Again we have to wait to hear about cost and timing implications. Each class and our school council will be involved in the developments.
