How our pupils are conducting themselves out of school on the local park, in the local shops and on social media is causing school considerable concern. We are finding ourselves spending a lot of time trying to manage situations that are beyond school's control. We ask that you support us by supervising your child when they are playing out and that all use of social media is monitored. Please see the article below that explains the risk of another type of media that is used by school children:

Have you heard about the app. <a href="musical.ly">musical.ly</a>? It is an app that has been out for nearly a year and enables the user to create videos to impress their family and friends by selecting a sound and lip sync with favourite songs. The end product can then be shared on Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, Messenger, WhatsApp and Vine. The trend is to get 'fans' from the <a href="musical.ly">musical.ly</a> community and see how their music videos rank on the leaderboard. It has an age rating of 12+ and can be harmless and good fun if used sensibly.

A number of our pupils are using the app, many under the age of 12, with their privacy setting left open, consequently their videos are available for the whole wide world to see. Even more worrying, a large number of videos have been filmed with pupils wearing their school uniform, which is not acceptable. This would make it very easy to locate the school and individual, putting everyone at risk. The trend to build up the number of 'fans' when the account is not private attracts unknown followers.

This unfortunately is an ideal start for any potential groomer. Another fact, recently a man has been prosecuted for grooming a 10 year old girl through this app.

As a responsible parent, please check the settings on your child's electronics for all social media apps and ensure they are set to private.

## **Gentle Reminders:**

As mentioned many times the carpark at the front of school is designated for the staff that work within our school only. We ask that all our families respect this and park outside the school grounds after 08:00. Only this week two of our teachers reported that they nearly hit children who were running across the carpark to access school.
