It is important that as a School we prepare our pupils positively for life in modern Britain by promoting the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect. We endeavour to meet this aim through running a school council, through operating our positive behaviour strategies – team points, Star of the Week and Carleton Codes and our PSHE lessons. However, we are finding that social media is influencing the younger generation in such a way that we need to provide specific education to ensure their safety. I have invited the police to run a course for our school to assist us in educating and therefore protecting our children. I hope that these sessions are fun and engaging whilst being age appropriate. Before these commence I will be sending home details of the contents of these sessions.

The charity Committee met this week and would like school to support Breast Cancer Awareness this year. To do this we would like all children to come to school on Friday the 21<sup>st</sup> with a £1 donation; wearing either a pink top or a brightly coloured top. We ask that uniform is worn for the bottom half please.

We have some very exciting news to share with you. Miss Clarkson is expecting her first child. We are thrilled for her and are already looking forward to meeting our Carleton baby. Yellow and Brown Ducklings - Autumn sensory walk, living graphs, measuring height, kicking balls, rolling tyres, teamwork and practicing letter formation.
