In our never ending drive to raise standards we constantly reflect on all that is taking place within school. This involves listening to the children and to all the families associated with our school. Monitoring the teaching and learning opportunities within our setting is a highly important part of the process. Thank you so very much for allowing us the time to look through your reading records. We particularly liked seeing how some of you use the books to communicate with school about all aspects of your child's development alongside their reading. We want there to be greater communication from school about how your child is progressing with their reading to support you further at home. Ideally your child needs to be heard to read every day and a quick note from home evidences this. At school there needs to be at least two entries a week recording the work carried out to move their reading skills along.

Children also benefit greatly from listening to bedtime stories. The best readers in our school tend to be those that enjoy curling up to a regular bedtime story. Please record these experiences too.

We are to see which class is putting the most effort in with their reading every week. We also are holding a competition this half term holiday where we are inviting you to send in photographs of the most extreme places your child has been caught reading. Teachers too will be taking part. I am looking forward to sharing these in our Tuesday assembly and the first newsletter upon our return. The winner will receive a voucher to spend on a book.

Homework too although not a legal requirement, is a vital part of our school in that it is our way of sharing your child's learning with you at home. Every week your child is sent home with homework. School will mark and feedback your child's achievements. Please comment in these books how your child has approached the work set and how well they did to complete the tasks. Well done to those families that complete their homework each week.

Key research

In the early years, parental involvement has a significant impact on children's cognitive development and literacy and number skills.

Parental involvement in a child's schooling for a child between the ages of 7 and 16 is a more powerful force than family background, size of family and level of parental education. Parental involvement has a significant effect on pupil achievement throughout the years of schooling Educational failure is increased by lack of parental interest in schooling. In particular, a father's interest in a child's schooling is strongly linked to educational outcomes for the child Most parents believe that the responsibility for their child's education is shared between parents and the school Many parents want to be involved in their children's education. In a recent study in England 72% of parents said that they wanted more involvement.


Safety Notice:
