We have been made aware of increasingly dangerous parking outside school at drop offs and collection. We feel we are well positioned on the Arundel estate, with a large amount of convenient spaces and footpaths on the surrounding streets enabling members of our school community to park in a courteous, legal and safe manner. Please can we remind all parents to respect our neighbours at all times.

Please also be aware that the staff car park is for staff and deliveries only. The car park shouldn't be used at any times of the day for dropping children off at Breakfast or After School Club, or as a walk through for safety reasons.

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Sports' day is planned to take place on the afternoon of Monday and so we ask that all children come to school wearing their kit. As it is our Healthy Living Week in school there are lots of activities planned where your child will need to come to school wearing their PE kit on these days also:

The Year Two children have had a very busy week in school and have been able to demonstrate their learning very well. We are super proud of their attitude towards their tests. We thank you for supporting with learning at home as it is highly evident that the children are working beyond the school day.

Today we welcomed a visitor from 'Building Bridges' which is an organisation that visits schools across the county to support the teaching and learning of Religious Education. These visits are organised through Lancashire SACRE (Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education) who plan our RE curriculum. The visitor shared their experiences of being a Muslim in our local community. These visits bring the curriculum alive and promote community cohesion, because our visitors are able to speak from personal experience and talk in much greater detail about their religion. They led a whole school assembly about Islam, sharing elements of their lifestyle/beliefs with the children. Year 5/6 and Year 1/2 children then participated in workshops where they had lots of questions! They were able to handle artefacts and share discussions with each other and the visitor. The purpose is to educate and learn about the experience of a person of faith. We had a visit from this organisation several years ago, which proved to be very interesting and beneficial for our children.

Later this term we will have a visit from a member of the Sikh community to work with our Year 3/4 children.

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Operation Encompass Parents Awareness Letter

Dear Parent/Carer,

This letter is to inform you that our school is participating in Operation Encompass.

Operation Encompass is a unique Police and Education early intervention safeguarding partnership which ensures that a child school is informed, prior to the start of the next school day, that there has been a domestic abuse, vulnerable child or missing incident to which the child or young person has been exposed, and which might then have an impact on them in school the following day.

Each school is informed of all such incidents, not just those where an offence can be identified or those which are graded as high risk. The partnership recognises that all domestic abuse, vulnerable child and missing incidents can be harmful to children and young people.

This information will be shared throughout the year, including holidays and weekends. Information will only be shared with the school by the police where it is identified that a young person was present, witnessed or was involved.

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A nominated member of staff, known as a Key Adult, has been trained to liaise with the police. At Carleton Green Community Primary School our Key Adults are Mrs McGrath and Mrs McEvilly. They will be able to use information that has been shared with them, in confidence, to ensure that the school makes provision for possible difficulties experienced by children or their families. The Key Adults will keep this information confidential and will only share it on a need-to-know basis, for instance, to teaching staff for the child or young person. It will not be shared with other school students.
