This is a whole school event so please also make sure that your child/children come to school on the event day in their PE Kits!

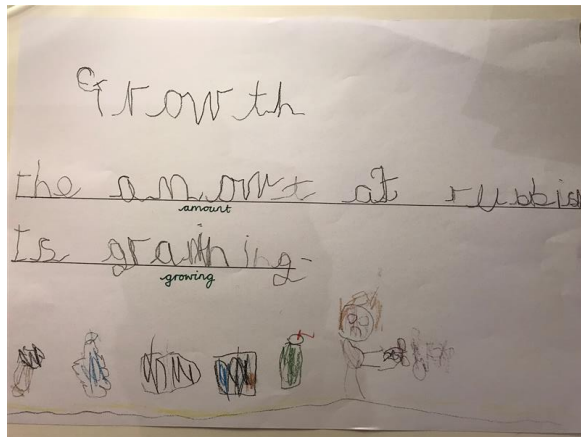

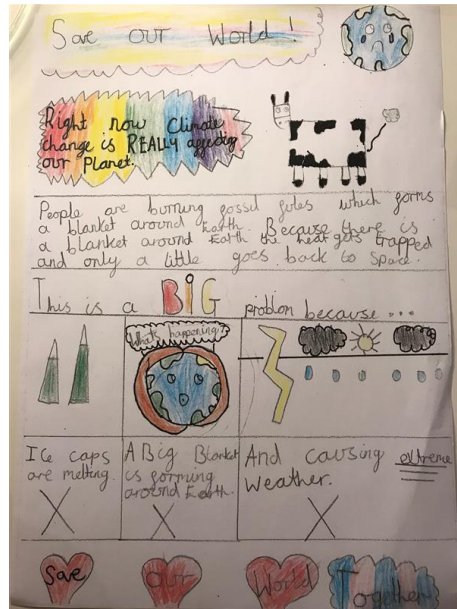
