Our wonderful Year Six's have a busy week ahead of them and so we hope that they enjoy a lovely, relaxing weekend. We do not want any of our children (or parents) worrying about the tests that are to take place over the week. Despite COVID, they are all thoroughly prepared and more than capable of achieving well in them. On Monday they will have the spelling and punctuation tests, on Tuesday their reading

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comprehension, on Wednesday they have an arithmetic test followed by a reasoning maths paper. On Thursday they have a second reasoning maths paper. All of the tests are planned to take place in the mornings of these four days with the children being supported by their teachers and the staff in school. We hope that they actually manage to enjoy the experience and can show off their talents.

I have been thrilled to learn that Theo M came first in a recent running event. Clearly school's running club on a Wednesday is having a positive impact!!! (His family do lots of running) I am looking forward to hearing about how Harry P does in his triathlon events that are coming up.

On the 27th May we are to hold jubilee celebrations where each class has chosen a decade of our Queen's ruling. We ask that the children come dressed in something of that period rather than their uniform for the day. We are also to hold a picnic at lunchtime and eat altogether. Whether this is as a street party held outside or in our school hall is very much dictated by the weather and will be decided on the day.

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Attendance in school is always a priority for us. Naturally, good attendance correlates with good outcomes for our children. This is not purely due to the children accessing all their learning in the school day but is attributed to the positive attitudes towards education within their home environment. A supportive household is one that engages positively and actively with school where they are mindful about punctuality, carry out home learning, support the wider aspects of school life such as ensuring participation in clubs and school events and work hard to ensure great attendance takes place. All of these factors impact towards pupils realising their full potential.

We take our registers at the start of each school day and will chase up all absences by 09:30. If we have not heard about why your child is not in school please be aware that we will phone and send an email. Very rarely, when we have still not had any response we will carry out a home visit. I hope you can understand, we have a safeguarding role to ensure that all our pupils are safe. If we are not satisfied that a pupil is safe; it is our duty to notify the Pupil Attendance Support Team and the Police. There is an absent reporting link on our website that is easy to navigate so you can report your child's absence.

Safeguarding is not simply about pupil's school attendance though and as such it is important that we are up to speed at school with the latest training to ensure that we are equipped to keep children safe.
