## A message from the local church

Some time ago, before COVID, we (the churches of St Martin's and St Hilda's) used to hold a coffee morning each Thursday from 11am - 1pm. It was open to anyone and everyone who wished to pop in, it was free of charge but donations towards consumables were gratefully received.

We would very much like to restart these weekly coffee mornings and the offer of a warm space for the local community of Carleton, as a place to come along and meet others for a brew and a chat in a warm and welcoming environment. As such, it would not be a 'church' event, it's just that we have a building that is central, accessible and heated and the will to make it happen.

However, in the intervening time our congregation have got older and smaller, and we would now struggle to man this every week. So, we are putting feelers out to see if there are any members of the local community who would be able and willing to help. We are hoping that we can get a list of 25 people, then each person would only be called upon once every couple of months. We do not feel that we could recommence the coffee mornings until we have enough volunteer support in place.

The volunteers are needed to set out and clear away the tables and chairs, make tea and coffee and wash up. All the consumables will be provided by the church and, at least initially, there would always be one volunteer present who already knows where things are kept and how the equipment works.
