

# A message from the PTFA

#### Harvest

This year, as in previous years, we are going to be supporting Street Life. Last year Street Life supplied over 500 emergency food parcels to local young people living in poverty. The cost-of-living crisis continues to have a significant impact on young people with Centrepoint's food insecurity report finding that 26% of vulnerable young people have less than £20 each month (after rent and bills), leaving them £5 or less a week to live off.

Street Life try to bridge this gap by providing emergency food parcels, often to young people living in temporary accommodation. Due to this, they may have limited access to cooking facilities; primarily only a kettle and sometimes a microwave oven to use.
