Please can you ensure your child is in school for 8.55 ready to start learning. The children enter their classrooms and their learning begins straight away.

School pick up - There are an increasing number of occasions that children are not being picked up on time. If you are aware that you are going to be late, I ask that you please phone the school office to inform us. Please do not message the class teacher on the day as they are unlikely to see the message due to teaching. I also ask that this is the case if there is a change of collection arrangements.

After school clubs run by class teachers
Children must be collected promptly at the end
of each club.

After February half term, we will be adapting our policy. If your child is late being collected on 2 separate occasions, they will be placed into After School Club and a charge will be made.

Unfortunately, if this becomes a regular occurrence, your child will not be allowed to participate in after school clubs.
