If you would like to become a reading volunteer, please express your interest to Mrs Clark or Mr Thorpe.






Reading fun!

Competition Time

As many of you will know, Robins Class have been participating in the Fishkeeper Fry Programme. Over the past 12 weeks the children have set up their own tank, tested the water, added plants and learnt how to clean the tank. Gradually, we have added a range of different fish.
