"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." - Luke 23:42

Being ready is not about waiting passively; it is about living courageously now. As scholars remind us, Christian vigilance is active - choosing love, justice and mercy while we await the fullness of Christ's Kingdom. Advent asks each of us:
