THEME FOR THE WEEK:
Mission - Unity John 16:13 THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

"The Spirit of Truth will guide you into all truth"

On the feast of the Holy Spirit, we reflect on John 16:13, where Jesus promises the coming of the Holy Spirit to guide us into all truth. This passage highlights the unity and harmony within the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—emphasizing their distinct roles yet perfect unity. St Augustine said, "If you see charity, you see the Trinity," reminding us that love binds the Trinity and should bind us as well. The Father sends the Holy Spirit to guide us into all truth, calling us to support and affirm one another in mutual respect, building on the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, we are expected to live in harmony and truth, fostering communities built on respect and understanding. Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we are drawn into deeper communion with God and one another, embracing the divine unity of the Trinity in our relationships and personal reflections.

The Solemnity of Pentecost (Sunday 8th June) John 20:22 - "He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'" Pentecost marks the birth of the Church and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Empowered by Christ's breath of peace, we are sent on mission – to bring hope, truth, and love to the world. The Spirit gives us the courage to be witnesses in our words and actions.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity (Sunday 15th June) John 16:13 - "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth." On Trinity Sunday, we celebrate the mystery of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – a relationship of perfect love and unity. We are invited into this divine life, guided by the Spirit, walking with Christ, and loved by the Father.

Ordinary Time We return to Ordinary Time – marked by the liturgical colour green, the colour of life. This season reminds us to meet Jesus in the everyday and in the ordinary moments of our lives. We walk with Jesus, in the light of the Holy Spirit each day.

 **Key Stage 3 Assessments** – Our KS3 students have been working incredibly hard on their end-of-year assessments; well done to everyone for their dedication and effort.

 **Year 11 & Year 13 – Exam Season in Progress** – Our Year 11 and Year 13 students continue to work very hard in their exams. The final formal exam is on Friday 20th June. It is imperative that students attend college every day during the exam season, as crucial content is still covered in lessons and attendance supports success. Periods 3 and 5 are dedicated to subjects with exams that afternoon or the following morning, while all other lessons focus on exam preparation. If exams for a subject are complete, students must bring independent revision work to use in lessons.
