### **Post Ofsted**

When Ofsted inspected the school in October they asked us to focus on a couple of subjects to strengthen the curriculum and assessment plans in those areas. I asked a former senior inspector to work with us and ensure we are moving in the right direction and he has so far spent two days in school. I am really pleased to say that after his recent visit he wrote to me and said 'it was clear to me that you were all determined to bring about improvements. As such, a substantial amount of work has been undertaken to act on the recommendations from our last meeting. I am of the opinion that the right steps are being taken and good progress is being made'. This is very encouraging and I thank the staff involved.

#### **Covid matters**

Yesterday we took the decision to follow national Government advice and remove the requirement to wear a face covering in communal areas – it is now a matter of personal preference. The number of Covid cases in school has gone down over the past few weeks from the high 70s to the 30s and we hope it continues this downward trend. If there was to be a rise in cases resulting in a directive from Public Health then we would have to reintroduce face coverings but hopefully that will not be the case.
