Our Mission Statement:

We are proud to belong to the Carr Hill Community where we pursue excellence through commitment, aspiration, resilience and respect.

The school returned from lockdown on September 1st 2020

During the first lockdown we had a maximum of 25 students in school daily who were classed as vulnerable. Year 10 students were invited in for 4 weeks at the end of the summer term and maximum attendance there was 70%. They had 4 hours of Maths, 4 hours of English and 2 hours of each option subject, taught in their set classes, over those 4 weeks.

Year 7 were invited in for one session with their mentors focussing on how they were coping with lockdown.

Work during lockdown was set on Show My Homework daily or though posting/delivering workpacks for those who did not have easy access to devices because of siblings sharing/parental need or no access. Around 130 students in Years 7-10 had access issues.

Despite being chased up there were 60 students who rarely, if ever, engaged with online learning even though they had access – around 7% of the student population.

During the second lockdown in Spring 2021 we were in a much stronger position regarding remote learning. 150 devices (laptops and chromebooks) were been loaned to students along with 2 dongles and 33 students received Wifi codes from BT to enable internet access. In order to aid remote learning, as well as the policy and expectations on the website, there were 7 youtube videos showing students how to access remote learning via synergy and teams as well as upload work for assessment and feedback. ICT technicians provided ICT support over the phone (they were able to offer face to face socially distanced support in school but this wasn't required) where students and parents were struggling to access remote learning.

Following the ending of lockdown, there continues to be an expectation that staff put lesson resources on Synergy for all lessons so that any students isolating can access the learning. Faculties have adapted curricula as appropriate and are updating curriculum maps for 2021-22 to address any gaps in learning.

Catch up 2020-21 is based around

- Specific whole school actions and high quality teaching and learning in each lesson – link to the School Improvement Plan and Teaching & Learning priorities – along with Social Emotional and Mental Health support
- Subject specific catch up and curriculum adjustment
- Targeted academic and pastoral interventions

The 2020-21 catch up premium equated to £77,130. In addition we received £30,310 for testing

We do not know if there will be additional catch up premium in 2021-22 but do expect around £20-£30k for summer school (numbers not yet finalised)

Costs in the plan are what we are actually spending to address gaps in learning and are not limited to the catch up premium. Costs from the actual catch up premium are highlighted in yellow.
