In maths:

The children will sing counting songs and number rhymes, count objects using 1:1 correspondence, match objects into shape, size, colour and compare them, sort objects using different criteria and be introduced to the numbers 1 and 2.

In Literacy:

The children will listen to stories, explore sounds and rhymes, draw pictures which represent themselves and their feelings, explore the letters in their name, begin to form some letters and begin learning the sounds s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k

Parent Challenge

Please talk to your child about what the word unique means and how you (the parent) are unique.


