

Homework Survey

Homework Survey Insights

The homework survey received feedback from 67 participants, providing valuable perspectives on the role and structure of homework. Below are the key takeaways:

1. Strong Support for Homework

A significant majority (88%) of respondents believe that homework is essential, with 59 respondents supporting it. However, a small number felt homework should be optional (1 respondent) or not given at all (6 respondents)

2. Reading is the Most Valued Activity

Reading was identified as the most beneficial homework task, mentioned by 49 respondents. Other highly valued activities include maths (28 mentions) and writing (25 mentions)

3. Challenges with Homework

Parents shared concerns about the stress homework can create at home, particularly when children are tired after school or juggling extracurricular activities. Balancing time for homework and personal downtime is still a challenge for many families

4. Call for Creative and Tailored Tasks

Parents expressed a preference for homework that is engaging, manageable, and aligned with their child's learning needs. Creative, project-based, and reading-focused tasks were highlighted as particularly effective and enjoyable.


1. Do You Think Children Should Have Homework?

Reasons for No


- Tired after school

2. How Long for Homework?


- 0 minutes: 4

3. How Often for Reading Homework?


- 1-3 times per week: 12
