

Early Years

This week, the children have had a very exciting expedition to Antarctica! We explored the different features and wildlife living there. They have been learning about several different explorers who have attempted or made it to the South Pole including Shackleton, Amundsen and Scott. In maths, we have been comparing mass, exploring capacity using the terms full, empty, nearly full and nearly empty and measuring.

Next week, we will be comparing the similarities and differences between the Arctic and Antarctica and discussing the animals that live there, we will also be reading the book 'The Emperor's Egg' and writing simple sentences about the life of an emperor penguin.

In maths, we will be introducing and exploring the number 6, revising 2D shapes, learning about hexagons and thinking about how there are different ways of making the same amount.

On Tuesday (**20th January**) at **9am**, we are hosting a handwriting workshop where we will be demonstrating our handwriting lessons followed by a presentation explaining our handwriting scheme – Kinetic letters. We would love to see you there!

Year 1

We have already completed the 2nd week of our exciting project 'Showtime'! This week the children have continued to retell the story of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and have written about the middle part of the story, using phrases and simple sentences. We have also revisited contractions, for example **can not** in contracted form becomes **can't** and **do not** becomes **don't**. The children have also been busy designers this week and have created some fantastic designs for their puppets! Next week we will be discussing suitable materials to use for their puppets so that they do not fall apart like Mrs Fulbrook's and Miss Tripp's!

In Maths we have continued our **Place Value** block. This week the children have learnt about more than and less than within 20. The children have been securing their understanding of counting forward and backwards for any given number within 20. We are very impressed with their progress on this unit so far but please continue familiarising your child with teen numbers and which order they go in at home if possible!
