In maths they have wowed us with their work on positional language, describing where things are in pictures and in small world scenes. First of all, we would like to thank everyone who was able to come to our project outcome on Wednesday. We hope that you enjoyed your time, looking at all of the children's hard work and perhaps making a bug hotel or planting some cress seeds. We would like to thank you for all the donations that you so kindly gave for the plant sale, thank you for taking the seeds home to plant and look after! The children have worked so hard during the project and have really enjoyed all of the hands-on experiences that have come their way.

In maths this week the children have learned about telling the time to the hour and half past the hour. They have learned about the hour and minute hand and have labelled clocks using the correct hands and written the right time next to analogue clocks.

Next week the children will be discussing their favourite memory of the year, drawing and writing about their year, to create a class year book which they will take with them into year 2. This will be an opportunity for children to use their writing skills that they have developed throughout the year. In maths there will be consolidation activities that link to learning that the children have previously completed during the year, for instance adding, subtracting, using arrays and counting in 2, 5 and 10's.

Important Update – Wraparound Care Fees for 2025–26 and Autumn Term 1 (1st September – 24th October 2025) Bookings at CASTLE HILL INFANTS SCHOOL

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we prepare for the new academic year, we would first like to thank you for your ongoing support and for choosing Magna to care for your child. We remain committed to providing high-quality, reliable wraparound care that inspires, captivates, and engages every child who attends.

Over the past year, we have made every effort to maintain our current pricing structure despite increasing pressures. However, **recent changes introduced by the government**, including further increases to the National Minimum Wage and employer National Insurance contributions, alongside rising costs in food, utilities, staffing, and rent payable to schools, have made it no longer viable for us to operate under the current rates.

To ensure we can continue to offer the level of care, staffing, and resources that you expect from us, **we will be updating our fees from September 2025** as follows:

- Breakfast Club: £7.00 per session
- After School Care: £16.00 per session

This increase reflects the true cost of delivering our service sustainably and responsibly.

We appreciate your understanding and continued partnership as we navigate these changes.
