Although the sun is shining, please could we ask that all children bring a coat into school each day. As we know, the British weather can be so changeable.


On Wednesday we celebrated National Fitness Day with 10 minutes of exercise at 10am. The whole school participated in this.

Early Years

What a fantastic week we've had in Early Years!

The children are continuing to settle in brilliantly. They are becoming increasingly confident with our daily routines and are building strong foundations for their learning journey.

This week in Maths, we've had great fun exploring the concepts of **big and small** as well as **more and less**. The children loved getting hands-on during Sparkle Time, using practical activities to reinforce and deepen their understanding.

In our project lessons, we've continued to talk about emotions using *The Colour Monster* as a guide. This story has helped the children to recognise and name their feelings, and we've begun exploring simple strategies they can use to manage them. It's been wonderful to see them becoming more confident to express themselves.

The children also completed their first entry in their project books, drawing something they love and explaining why it's special to them. This was a lovely opportunity for self-expression and helped us learn more about their individual interests.

Tapestry is now up and running! Keep an eye out for updates on how your child is settling into Early Years — we're excited to share their learning journey with you.

Looking ahead to next week:

- We'll be continuing our focus on ourselves and others, encouraging the children to explore what makes them unique and celebrating differences among us
- Handwriting will begin and we start learning our first set of sounds in Phonics!
- In **Maths**, we'll be learning about the concepts of **same and different**, with opportunities to compare and match objects
- Time to Talk books will be sent home on Monday. Please read the information inside the front cover. We hope you enjoy sharing these talking tasks with your child as they will support them to join in with discussions and learning in class. It would be great if you could record any discussions you have in the book for us to see and make sure that they are in book bags each day

This week we have had trouble reuniting uniform back with the rightful owners. Please could you ensure all belongings are clearly labelled. As the weather changes, please could you make sure that your child has a named coat in school as they do have the opportunity to access the outside area.

Year 1

It's been a busy week! We have introduced adjectives and verbs this week and the children have come up with their own sentences to write about the characters from the book, Somebody Swallowed Stanley! We have also looked at past tense and practised writing words with an 'ed' ending.

In maths, we have been consolidating < > and = as well as looking at ordering. Next week we will be introducing part-whole models and fact families.

The children are very excited about their trip to QMC on Monday, the knowledge that they will gain there will enhance the science we will be focusing on in class next week.

A polite reminder that forest school is on a Wednesday afternoon.

The homework diary that was used in early years carries over into year 1. If you no longer have that diary, please let us know so that your child's reading can be recorded.

Year 2

It has been a very busy week in Year 2! This week the children have researched polar bears using Britannica and have used this information to write fact files. We have read more of our story 'The Journey Home' and have met a new animal – the panda. The children have recapped nouns and adjectives to create expanded noun phrases such as big busy city and tall pointy buildings.

In maths, the children have revisited comparing objects and numbers. They have used numbers up to 100 and compared them using the symbols for greater than >, less than < and equal to =. We have also recapped counting in steps of 2s, 5s and 10s. Next week we will begin counting in steps of 3, recap bonds to 10 to then secure bonds to 20.

The children are excited about their trip to QMC on Tuesday. Sycamore will be going in the morning and Maple will be going in the afternoon.

Home learning will be sent home this week in children's Time to Talk books. In there, you will find the slip which will advise which animal your child can research and create their habitat in a box.


