Early years have had a very busy week! We have spent the week discussing the role of grandparents, what they do in a family and how important they are. We also have revisited our previous learning about community and how we all belong to a community (our family, school, class, clubs) and why. In maths, we have been exploring the number one and how it is formed. We have started to look at the number two and will continue to investigate and link amounts to numerals next week.

Next week, we will be exploring the festival of Diwali, learning the story of Rama and Sita and how Hindus celebrate Diwali. There will also be a focus upon **Astro the Appreciation Dragon.** We ask that you discuss with your child why we show appreciation and gratitude and how we could put it into practice both at home and school.

We have been very busy getting ready for our project outcome next week (**Wednesday 22**nd **October at 2:45pm**) and the children are very excited to share with you all their hard work! We look forward to seeing you there.

Year 1

We have had a very exciting week in Year 1 with the children creating their very own kites made from plastic bags, just like the one in 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley'! The children evaluated which materials would work best and explored different joining techniques to create their kites. It was lovely seeing so many of you join us on Thursday and we hope you enjoyed seeing lots of what your child has been learning as well as testing out their kites.

In maths, we have continued with addition number sentences and the children were introduced to rekenrek as a resource to help them. We have now moved onto subtraction and how to write subtraction number sentences, which we will be continuing next week.

Next week we will be starting our new project 'Fire! Fire!' all about the Great Fire of London! We will be sending home the project overview on Monday which will contain all the information you need to know.

Just to remind you there is no forest school next Wednesday, but it will be starting up again after half term.

Year 2

This week, the children have taken an exciting trip to Kenya and Mauritius, enhancing their geographical language. The children found out that the temperature of these countries is very hot because they are near the equator. Next week, the children will write a recount of the journey in our key story, 'The Journey Home', using time adverbials such as 'later on' 'after that', 'finally'.

In maths, the children are adding 10 more and subtracting 10 less, taking away 1-digit numbers from 2-digit numbers across a ten. E.g. 24 - 8 = 16. We have reinforced bonds to 10 to help them solve the problems crossing tens, please could you practice bonds to 10 at home including addition and subtraction. E.g. 10 - 7 = 3 7 + 3 = 10

showcase their learning about endangered animals and raise awareness of the crisis that the animal world is facing. Join us in our fundraising event to help support and adopt one! As a year group, we have been looking at the WWF website.
