Early Years

What a fun-filled week we've had!

As part of our *Great Outdoors* project, we've been learning all about **hibernation**. The children have really enjoyed finding out which animals hibernate and how they keep warm during the winter months.

This week, the children became little **designers**, planning and creating cosy homes to help animals stay safe in the cold weather. They thought carefully about the materials they would choose and why. Your

We also welcomed **Mr Whistler** back to Early Years. The children were excited to share everything they have learnt and talked together about different ways they could use the leaves that they have collected outside.

In **maths**, we have been exploring the number **5**. The children have done brilliantly with sorting objects that represent 5 and even made their very own number blocks.

Our **Twinklly Nativity** rehearsals are going really well. We have sent home your child's lines again this week — please continue to practise these together at home.

Your child's **Purple Mash login** has now been added to the back of their home diary. This will give you access to a range of activities they can enjoy at home.

Early Years Team

Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have been wrapping up our 'Fire! Fire!' project by completing a watercolour background and black silhouette to create the final artwork piece. The children have also showed their knowledge by creating a timeline and writing about it in their books. Finally, we looked into what happened after the fire was out and wrote a sentence about this. We are so pleased that the children have really enjoyed this project and they have produced some amazing work!

Next week is our project outcome on **Thursday 4th of December at 2:45pm**. As it has been designed as a time tunnel, we ask that parents joining us follow the map given to them at the entrance so that you can experience the events of the fire in the correct order! We will also be providing you with some prompts to ask the children at each station as they are very eager to share what they have learnt with you.

In maths we have done some additional work with 2D and 3D shapes. The children have been on a shape hunt and have labelled the shapes in their books. Next week we will be going back over addition and subtraction as consolidation.

Thank you to parents that have sent their child in with their costumes for the Christmas performance, just a reminder that these needed to be in this week. Our Christmas play will be performed on Thursday the 11th of December at 9:10 (adults only) and 2:15 (everyone invited).

Year 2

This week the children have been great geographers locating Lake Taupo on a map as well as writing some fabulous acrostic poems about Lake Taupo and the Waitomo Caves.

In maths, the children have finished their unit on addition and subtraction, finishing with comparing number sentences. For example, $13 + 5 < 13 + 9$. $13 + 5 = 18$ and $13 + 9 = 22$. 18 is less than 22.

Next week, we will start to write leaflets using expanded noun phrases such as 'Come and see the wonderful, exciting Waitomo caves.'

In maths, we have started our new unit on shape, looking at sides and vertices (corners) on 2D shape. We will also look at vertical lines of symmetry. For example,
