Understanding the World

The children will:

- Know that the world is made up of different countries and that we live in England
- Recognise some similarities and differences between the natural world in England, the Polar regions and China
- Understand that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times, focusing on Chinese New Year
- Explore melting and freezing

Communication and Language

The children will:

- Talk about non-fiction texts and find out information about the Polar Regions and China
- Use new vocabulary to join in class discussions about the Polar Regions,
 Chinese New Year and the world around them

Expressive Art and Design

The children will:

- Play tuned and un-tuned percussion instruments
- Move to music and perform a Chinese New Year Dragon dance
- Explore colour mixing and different techniques to create a polar animal







Rationale - what's it all about?

The children will find a suitcase with a lost luggage label on it. On opening the suitcase they will discover clues which will lead them to a discovery. They will embark on 'The Magic Ride' to help a great explorer. Learning that the world is made up of different countries, they will travel to the Polar Regions and China, looking at similarities and differences with England.

Learning Value: Creativity

The children will:

- Generate ideas and make connections
- Use their imagination to transport themselves to unknown worlds and think of things they have never experienced
- Use tools and materials to produce pictures

Learning Value: Thinking

The children will:

- Process a variety of information
- Explain and justify their ideas using recently introduced vocabulary
- Undertake research
- Evaluate their art work and think of what they could do to make it even better

Literacy

The children will:

- Read letters by saying a sound for each one
- Continue blending with the sounds they have learnt
- Write a fact file about polar animals







Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will:

- Develop a sense of community and responsibility for the world
- Begin to follow instructions involving multiple ideas or actions
- Continue to work on being able to wait for what they want

Physical Development

The children will:

- Continue to use core muscle strength to achieve a good posture
- Use tools such as scissors, pencils and paintbrushes carefully and with increasing control
- Begin to move with more fluency, developing style and control

The children will:

- Recognise 0
- Count objects, actions and sounds
- Compare numbers and order them
- Learn about 6.7.8 and 9
- Name and describe the properties of shapes
