<u>Year 1</u>

This week in our project writing the children have used adjectives in their writing to write about the seagull in the whale. The children have also been learning about -ed endings for verbs such as splashed and pecked. The children are continuing to develop their independence in their writing skills.

In maths we have been working on place value and have been completing number tracks with missing numbers. The children have been learning about greater than and less than, using the symbols to complete number sentences.
