How can you prepare your child for school?



- ► Talk to your child
- Come to the stay and play sessions
 - Share the teacher videos
 - Practise putting on their uniform and PE kit and taking it off again



How can you prepare your child for school?



- ▶ Involve them in naming their belongings
 - Practise your route to school
 - Practise recognising their name
- Share books, nursery rhymes and songs
- Count and look for numbers in the environment



How can you prepare your child for school?

Encourage your child to be independent with going to the toilet and wiping

Encourage them to wash their hands

Encourage them to use a knife and fork at the table
