

Relationship and Sex Education (RSE)

Dear Parent/Carer,

Nowadays there are a vast amount of, sometimes confusing, information about relationships and sex on the internet, TV, in magazines, etc. For young people this can sometimes make an already confusing time seem even more complicated! Therefore, as part of the school's Personal, Social and Health Education programme your child will soon receive lessons on relationships, sexual health and puberty, which we have taught successfully in school for many years.

The purpose of Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) is to provide knowledge and understanding of how the human body changes during puberty and the processes of human reproduction, within the context of relationships based on love and respect. It should develop understanding and attitudes which will help pupils to form relationships in a responsible and healthy manner.

If young people can start their transition into adulthood with good information and the confidence and knowledge to understand what is happening to them, they will hopefully grow into confident and healthy adults able to make positive choices. This can start with learning the basics about growing up and the sessions in school may reinforce what you are already doing at home.

At CHPS, we are using the Twinkl scheme of learning, adapted to address the needs of our cohort. Children will have already taken part in lessons relating to body confidence and emotional changes they may experience during puberty. Our next lessons will focus on:

- Puberty for boys and girls revisited
- Understanding conception to the birth of a baby
- Becoming a teenager
- Respectful relationships.

Please note: at no point will a child be taught something that is inappropriate; and if a question from a child arises and the teacher feels it would be inappropriate to answer, (for example, because of its mature or explicit nature), the child will be encouraged to ask his/her parents or carers at home. The question will not be answered to the child or class if it is outside the remit of that year group's programme.

We strongly advise that you discuss these sensitive issues with your child prior to these lessons. These lessons will take place the week commencing 13th July 2026.

All lessons are taught using correct terminology, child-friendly language and diagrams.
