At Castle Hill Primary School all members of our school community will be listened to, valued, challenged and supported as individuals to recognise and achieve their aspirations, whatever it takes.

Collective worship at Castle Hill Primary School is a meaningful, daily practice. As well as providing a sense of unity and belonging, it also offers an opportunity to pause from the restlessness of life to reflect, respond and show reverence. It is a part of the educational provision of the school and therefore underpins all aspects of school life.

We aim to provide the opportunity for pupils to worship, to consider spiritual and moral issues and to explore their own beliefs; to encourage participation and response, whether through active involvement in the presentation of worship or through listening to and joining in the worship offered; and to develop community spirit, promote a common ethos and shared values, and reinforce positive attitudes.

The 1988 Education Reform Act have stated the legal requirements for collective worship in schools. Although collective worship must occur daily for all registered pupils, parents do to retain the right to withdraw their children from parts of, or all acts of collective worship.
