REMINDERS:

School Meal Price Increase: Hampshire County Council approved the price increase of primary school meals provided by HC3S to be increased to £2.50 from November 2020. The increase of 10p is due to rising staff costs, the forecast food inflationary pressures due to Covid-19 and leaving the EU on 31 December 2020.
