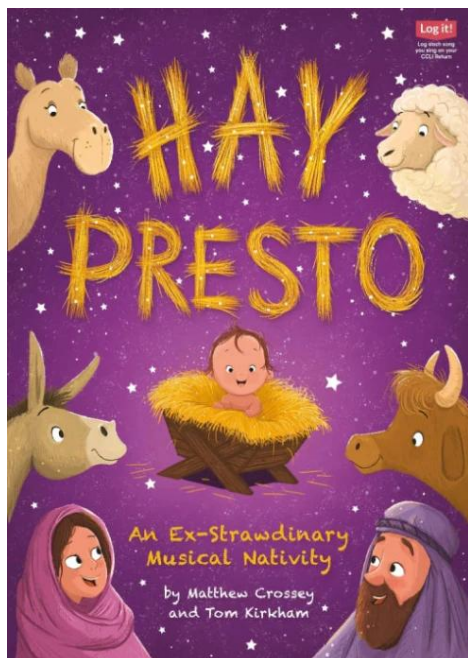

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are excited to announce that our Year 3/4 Christmas Production this year is **Hay Presto!**

There are several parts in this play, and we will be asking the children if they would like to audition. There are a range of roles including larger speaking roles, a smaller speaking role, a shared speaking part and non-speaking roles.

If your child would like to audition for a speaking role, please may they learn one of the shepherd's lines from Scene Seven (on the back of this letter). If they would like to audition for a singing solo, we will ask them to perform a well-known song on the day. We will be holding auditions on Thursday 16th October during school time, with the hope that scripts can be sent out over half term. We will of course do our best to accommodate the children's requests.
