Castle Newnham School Nursery Admission Policy

There is a separate policy statement for admissions to the Reception class. Parents and carers should be aware that attendance at the Nursery class does not necessarily guarantee subsequent admission into school.

This policy has been formed by Castle Newnham School Governors in agreement with the admission department of the local authority. The policy is as follows: -

- 1. That the Governors will admit up to the capacity of 30 children per session into the Nursery.
- 2. That the Nursery admits children aged 3 and 4. Children who have reached the required age for Reception admission (Their 5th birthday is between the 1st September and the 31st August in a given year) will not normally be permitted to attend the Nursery, unless there are exceptional circumstances, such as the child having severe Special Educational Needs.
- 3. Children are admitted at the start of the Autumn Term. Places are allocated according to the Over-Subscription Criteria.
- 4. Places may be offered at other times if they become available. Places that become available after the start of the Autumn term will be offered to existing nursery users first and then according to the OSC.
- 5. Families are given the opportunity to meet Nursery staff before the children are admitted.
- 6. Parents should only apply for sessions they actually need and will use.
- 7. A half-term's notice must be given of any cancellation or changes to requirements. With the interests of children in mind, children will not normally be changed between Morning and Afternoon sessions.
- 8. Children at the nursery may attend the Care Club (we have Little Care Club for children age 5 and under) subject to availability, as spaces are limited. Please note there is a charge for the use of the Care Club.
- 9. The school reserve the right to make adjustments to the number of sessions a child attends if the school deems it in the best interest of the child's wellbeing and development.
- 10. Any 1:1 supported pupil will be charged for the cost of their 1:1 staff for any additional sessions booked, including lunchtime support.
- 11. An additional charge will apply to all children who stay all day. This is to cover lunchtime supervision costs and is **not** part of the 30 hours free funding. Failure to pay invoices by the deadline may result in your child's nursery place being withdrawn. If there are any difficulties with payments, please speak to the school.
- 12. School meals are charged in addition to the lunchtime supervision cost.

Over Subscription Criteria (OSC)

Where the number of applications on behalf of children exceeds the capacity of the Nursery (30) the Governors will offer places, in the order stated, using the following criteria:

- 1. Looked after children
- 2. Children with an Educational Health and Care Plan that stipulates Castle Newnham School
- 3. Children with siblings already attending the South site (Goldington Road) and who will be remaining on the South site for at least 1 term.
- 4. Children who live closest to the school (a straight line on a map from the school to the parental home is used to calculate the distance). The parental home address is deemed to be where the child spends the majority of their school week, Monday to Friday, including nights. Evidence of address is required and may take the form of a utilities bill or council tax bill confirming name and address.
