British Science Week

We have had a wonderful time celebrating British Science week. The children have been immersed in rich learning opportunities, and they have learnt the following:

N/R: The children have been learning about caterpillars and the changes they go through as they turn into a butterfly. They have listened to the story of the Hungry Caterpillar and made rainbow paper chain caterpillars. They have also been growing peas and beans in the classroom and looking for changes.

Year 1/2: We learnt about how worms make great soil - which is so important in nature. We investigated how worms change dead leaves and waste materials into soil.

Year 3/4: We had a great time investigating what changes the way ice melts. We tested how fast it would melt with salt, sugar and water or heated with out hands. Heat had the fastest results, while we noticed the salt melted the ice slightly faster than the sugar. Some children created their own super-melter by combining the variables. We then learnt about how the ice around the world is melting due to changing temperatures and the climate.

Year 5/6: Year 5 and 6 investigated acids and alkalis. By adding Red Cabbage Indicator to everyday substances, like hand wash, lemon juice, vinegar and washing-up liquid, they were able to decide where they were on the PH scale. The substances changed colour, either showing an acidic or alkali substance. Lots of fun was had, not only watching the colours develop, but also finally mixing the substances together to cause other chemical reactions - we were very foamy by the end!

The children had such a wonderful time and learnt a lot about change and adaptation! Thank you to all the parents who were able to join us for our in class learning on Wednesday morning! The children loved sharing their learning with you all.
