Friday 20th March: Own clothes day in exchange for a chocolate/Easter egg donation.


Friday 27th March: Easter Bonnet Parade and PTA Easter event (more details to follow).

The Ministry of Justice is developing a new GOV.UK service to help separating parents and wider family members **understand their options for making child arrangements.**
