

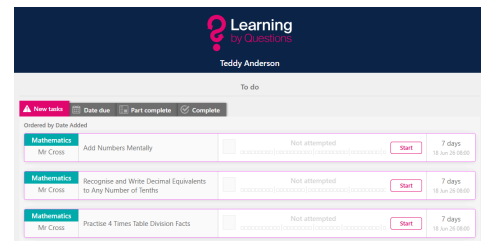
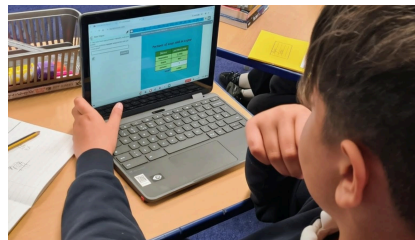
Friday Newsletter – 12th June 2026

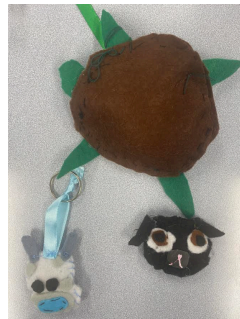
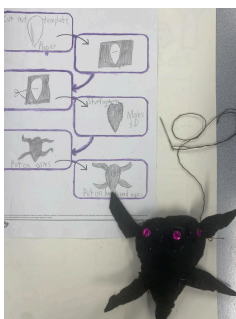
Superstars Certificates for outstanding work

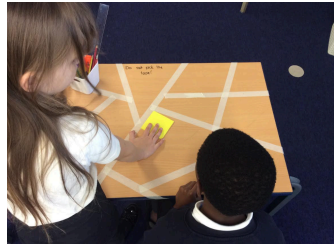


Year 3/4 - Angles!
