Year 5 Engineers

In Year 5, pupils have been designing and making their own theme park rides. This week, they have been using wooden dowels and wheels to make a simple pulley system. Their model will eventually be driven by an electrical motor. Using a range of components, the children have been also using a range of practical skills including cutting, sawing, joining and finishing accurately.
