EYFS and KS1

What a busy and enjoyable week our Reception and KS1 children have had!

In Reception, the children continued learning about animals and their habitats. They painted wild jungle animals, sorted animals into their correct habitats, and explored capacity in Maths by predicting and measuring the contents of different containers using water and pasta.

KS1 children continued their science work on materials, carrying out simple tests on a range of fabrics.

To end the week, everyone took part in the RSPB Big Birdwatch, making natural bird feeders and counting and identifying birds using tally charts.
