Miss Spencer's scientists

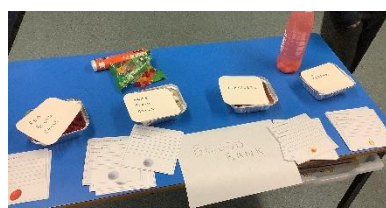
