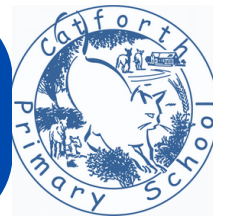


# Catforth Primary School Newsletter

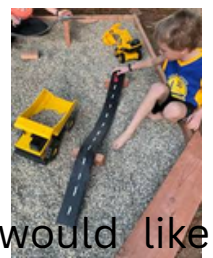
