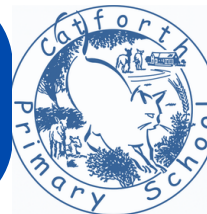


Catforth Primary School Newsletter

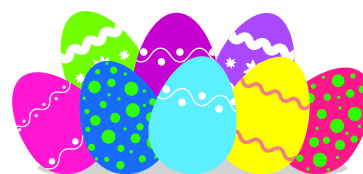


Dates for the diary

Tigers

Our week in Tigers began with a wonderful celebration of World Book Day, as the children arrived in a fantastic array of costumes. We loved sharing our favourite stories with one another and enjoyed listening to *The Day the Crayons Quit*. In English, we have been planning and beginning to write our own stories—innovations on *Pigs Might Fly*—set on Mudpuddle Farm. In Art, the children created impressive mini-beast collages using their own watercolour paintings. In R.E., we had great fun learning about the Jewish festival of Sukkot, which takes place in the autumn. Working in teams, the children built their own versions of Sukkahs to help them understand the traditions of this special celebration.



Jaguars



This week, the children have enjoyed writing their own version of the Pied Piper. They changed the character and what the town was infested with- they did an amazing job at writing their own traditional tale. We also really enjoyed starting the week with World Book Day- the children looked amazing! We have been looking at who helps us and keeps us safe in PSHE. In History, children have really enjoyed learning about the Plague. We have looked at what the symptoms were and how the nursery rhyme ‘Ring a ring a roses’ is about the Plague.

Panthers

On Monday we dressed up for world book day!! Have a look at some of our costumes. This week in English we have been learning about the rainforest and deforestation. After learning different facts, we had to stand in front of the class and talk for 2 minute about what we knew, using new vocabulary taught. We then looked at persuasive texts, eg the structure, language and features used. Our English is closely linked to Geography this term. The children learnt about palm oil plantations. We looked at different packaging and which products contained unsustainable palm. Only 3 out of the 40 odd packages used sustainable palm oil which. We have started creating a persuasive and informative poster about palm oil and will be writing a letter to a company persuading them to use sustainable palm oil. In Maths, the Y6's have been looking at converting fractions to decimals and vice versa. We have also been multiplying and dividing decimals by whole numbers.



Forest schools

It's been a fantastic week in Forest school this week! We have been so excited to see the frog spawn in the pond and lots of children have been sketching it and the pond area. Tigers learnt about the life cycle of frogs, Jaguars about where frogspawn sits in different food chains, while Panthers learnt about the differences between frogs and toads.
