

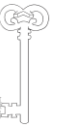
Maths

As mathematicians, we will continue to secure all times tables to 12x12, ready for the Year 4 multiplication check. We will secure previous learning linked to fractions and apply our learning in different types of problem-solving contexts. We will also practise telling the time and investigate the properties of shapes.



RE

In our Dialogue & Encounter unit, we will look St Paul's commitment to proclaiming the Gospel to the world. We will find out about the Syro-Malabar rite in the Catholic Church and how Christians in Lancaster work together for the common good. Finally, we will learn about the significance of the Five Pillars of Islam for Muslims.



Geography

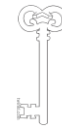

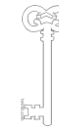
Science
