Christmas comes early for pupils at Central Lancaster High School

Our pupils are delighted that phase two of our £8 million pounds new build is nearing completion. Work starts in the new year on cladding the building and fitting out the inside.

The second phase of the build will house our maths and English departments. Downstairs, there will be 5 classrooms, a departmental office and a new toilet block. Upstairs there will be 5 classrooms, a departmental office and a dual aspect, fully resourced library that will look out over the city of Lancaster, Morecambe Bay and beyond to the view of the Lake District - a truly inspirational setting for our pupils to immerse themselves in literature.

Phase two is due for completion around May half term and complements phase one, which is now fully accessible to our pupils. It offers state of the art facilities including a design technology workshop, food technology room and IT suite. In addition, we have five new science labs, a lab prep room, toilets and departmental office space.




Matthew's head shave for 'Help for Heroes' and 'Little Princess Trust'

Sadly, the cancer returned with a vengeance and Joel, on learning that it was now incurable, shook the Doctor's hand and said, 'You tried your best.'




Every Christmas, we have a Jumpers for Joel day, where we raise money for Derian House Children's Hospice, who looked after Joel and his family in his final weeks. This year is particularly poignant since Joel would have been in Year 11. Joel was the most amazing and inspirational young man who never moaned or complained. His friends have said the following: 'It is a true honour for us to be able to carry on Joel Shaw's legacy even as our time at Longridge High School comes to end. Joel was quite a character to all who knew him. He was funny and kind-hearted and would always make you smile and laugh even if you weren't in the mood. He always put a smile on everyone's faces and lightened the mood every single day. When Joel had cancer, he always looked on the bright side. The fact, Joel could still joke about and be himself whilst undergoing treatment and battling this horrific illness, really inspires us and others who knew him.'

Joel embodies all that is good about Christmas – kindness, compassion, fun and love. We all miss him.

Christmas Concert

A Musical Christmas at Ripley


On Tuesday 12th December, Ripley Music Department delivered the most amazing **Christmas Concert** to a packed audience of family, friends and staff.
