



KS3 End of Year Examinations

KS3 pupils will be taking part in their end of year examination window from now until the end of the academic year. In this window, your child will be sitting their end of year examinations in the following subjects:

- English
- Maths
- Science
- History
- Geography
- Computing
- Design Technology
- Food Technology
- Music
- Art and Design
- Modern Foreign Languages (French and Spanish)
- Religious Education

The purpose of these examinations is to assess what your child has learnt and remembered from this year of study and whether they can apply that knowledge and skills in their examination. Classroom teachers have been preparing your child in lessons and homework will be set on ClassCharts to support your child with their preparation. Should you have any questions on the content of the examinations, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Both the English, maths and science examinations will be completed in the Sports Hall; this is where pupils in Year 11 sit their GCSEs. The timetable is below:

To help support your child, it would be beneficial if you could:

- Ensure that they are prepared for their examinations by having the correct stationery, attending school on time and they have completed any revision homework that has been set on ClassCharts
- Talk to your child about their examinations and ensure that they recognise the importance of them and of doing their best
- Test your child on their knowledge by asking them questions or talking to them about what they have studied.
