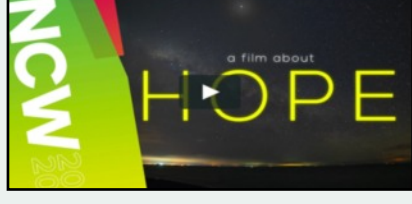
Monday 1st March

National Careers Week celebrates home school careers conversations Who Are We?

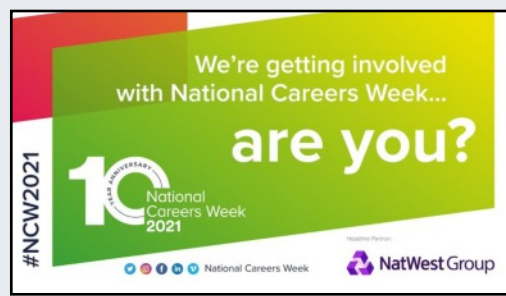
This is an opportunity for students and parents to consider what is important to them, and start a conversation on 'Who Are We?' and what is important to us.

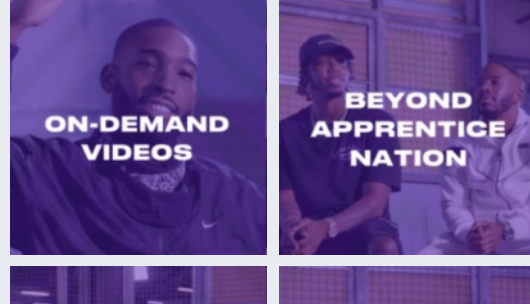
National Careers Week runs from the 1st to 6th March 2021, and aims to promote the importance of good careers education in schools and colleges.

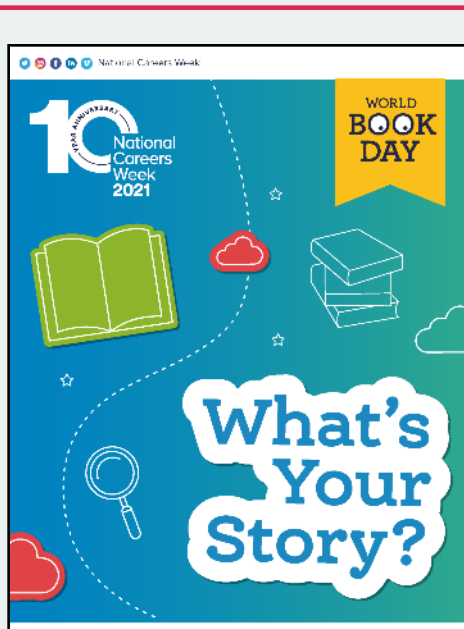
Thursday 4th March

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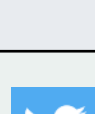
