We have had a wonderful first week in school. Our year 7s joined us last Friday and they have settled in really quickly and we have seen them grow in confidence as the week has progressed. Our older pupils have been welcoming, supportive of them and have embraced them into our school community and I thank them for that.

All pupils have looked incredibly smart and have worn our uniform with pride. I would like to thank you all for your support in ensuring this is the case. Going forward, if there are issues with uniform, please do not hesitate to contact your child's House Tutor and we will work together to find a solution.

I have had the privilege to be in and out many classrooms this week. There has been a real calm and orderly feel within the classroom which has allowed teachers to focus on their teaching and pupils on their learning. Pupils have actively engaged in their lessons and their behaviour has been excellent. This positive feel has also extended to break and lunchtimes. Pupils are walking around the school site with smiles on their faces and they have been incredibly kind, polite and respectful to their peers and staff.

Next week, our amended behaviour policy comes into practice. This has been shared with pupils at the start of this week and I have given them a reminder this morning. I have discussed the clear rationale behind the changes and how they will benefit each child in maximising all the opportunities available within school whilst preparing them for life beyond their time with us. As illustrated above, pupils have responded incredibly well to our collective raised expectations so we do not envisage any issues going forward.

I have attached a copy of our behaviour flow chart for your reference. The system is designed to allow opportunities for a pupil to correct their behaviour, should this be necessary, before it escalates to a potentially more serious sanction. You will see that there is an increased focus on punctuality both to school and lessons. Should there be a genuine reason for your child being late to school (arriving after 8.40 am), please can we ask you contact school in advance of their arrival. Pupils have a five minute 'window' between lessons to allow for movement across the school site and if needed, the opportunity to go to the toilet although we would encourage pupils to use these facilities before school and at break and lunchtime.

Any P3 or above sanction will be communicated directly with you via ClassCharts.

Staff are praising pupils who actively demonstrate our values of commitment, creativity and community. These many successes will be shared with pupils during form time, year group assemblies and end of term celebration assemblies.
