FSM over half term

The Government gives money to local councils to support households who would otherwise struggle with food bills, and to organise holiday & food programmes for school aged (4 - 16 year old) freeschool-meals registered children.

For the past few years Lancashire County Council have been able to use some of this funding to provide £15 per-week grocery vouchers to the families of pupils from Reception - Year 11 during school holidays.

Lancashire County Council have asked schools to order & administer the vouchers through EdenRed. Families will automatically receive the voucher codes by email and Lancashire County Council will be responsible for paying the invoices.

Please note that the school has no discretion over the eligibility for, or value of, the vouchers.

Lancashire County Council have just confirmed that approval has been granted for schools to utilise the LCC EdenRed account to order grocery vouchers for benefit-eligible Free-School-Meals-registered pupils in Years 7 to 11 for the Autumn Half Term Holiday.

Each eligible pupil will be issued with the equivalent of £15 per week in vouchers.

We will organise these vouchers to be emailed to eligible pupils' families on **Monday 17 October 2022**. Emails will be sent to the primary contact for each pupil.

Simply be with the sensations, thoughts, and emotions that arise without trying to control or change them. Observe them with the kindness of a mother watching her child at play. Be patient. If the emotions get uncomfortable, muster up your courage, strength, tenacity, and patience.

Set yourself a time limit and do not get up until the time is over. You can start with five minutes and eventually work up to sitting for 20 or 30 minutes at a time.

- A-Levels: At least five grade 5s or above at GCSE.
- BTEC Level 3: At least five grade 4s or above at GCSE.
- **T-Levels:** At least two grade 5s and three grade 4s or above at GCSE, including at least a grade 4 in Maths and English Language GCSE
- Mixed Programme (combining A-Levels with BTECs): At least two grade 5s and three grade 4s or above at GCSE.
- Level 2 BTEC: At least four grade 3s and at least a grade 4 or above in GCSE English Language and/or Maths.

Lancaster Girls Grammar School – Thursday 3 November

The entry requirements for LGGS are as follows:

A minimum of five GCSEs at Grade 6 or equivalent. They also require GCSE English language at Grade 4 as a minimum.

Grade 6 in the subjects to be studied at A Level, or in a similar subject if you have not studied this subject at GCSE. If you did not study separate sciences at GCSE then you need to achieve at least grades 6,6 in combined science to study A level physics, chemistry or biology.

To study A Level science subjects you must also have a minimum of Grade 5 in GCSE maths. To study further maths you must have at least Grade 7 in GCSE maths.

If you wish to study four A Level subjects then you must achieve Grade 8 in at least four GCSE subjects
