Covid-19 update – face coverings

As you may have seen on the news earlier this week, the government has removed the requirement for pupils to wear masks in the classroom as of yesterday. This has been communicated with pupils. We have been really pleased by how responsive and responsible pupils have been since the reintroduction of masks in school. If your child still wishes to wear their face covering in the classroom then they may.

Pupils are still required to wear face coverings when in inside communal areas. This will be reviewed by the government next Thursday. Face coverings need to be plain blue or black. We thank you for your continued support through this difficult time.

All our additional preventative measures to reduce the transmission of the virus remain in place.


Remembering Ebony
