## Thank you

As we come to the end of a very busy and productive academic year together, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our pupils for their wonderful daily contributions to school life and to you for your continued support.

There have been a number of highlights to celebrate this year with many individual and collective successes inside and out of the classroom, alongside the completion of phase 1 of our new build. The demolition of the 3-storey building is scheduled for Monday 14 August from which phase 2 construction starts in September with a scheduled completion of Easter 2024.

Phase 2 will house 5 English and 5 maths classrooms, a toilet block and a new library overlooking Lancaster, the bay and beyond – a truly inspirational learning environment for all our pupils and staff.

## School reopening in September 2023

School reopens for **Year 7 pupils only** on Monday 4 September and for **all** pupils on Tuesday 5 September.

The group meets at the White Cross in Lancaster, Tuedays 6.15pm – 8.30pm.

There is also a new group called '**Waves**' who meet on a **Thursday**, **6-8pm**, at the White Cross in Lancaster – for emotional wellbeing or feelings of anxiety.

#### **Prop Up Project**

The Prop Up Project is for young people aged 13-19 & 20-25. They run group & individual creative activities such as drama & art, encouraging the group to get involved, get to know each other and learn new skills at their own pace. Alongside this, each month, they run activities to equip the group with key coping strategies and skills to maintain positive mental health and build resilience outside of our sessions.

A referral is needed for these groups, and can be in the form of a conversation, either with the young person, a professional or parent etc. Following this, a time to meet with the young person before they attend is arranged.
