








## What's on Local: Lancashire Police Museum

 Located inside the walls of Lancaster Castle this museum is free of charge and open Thursday – Saturday during the summer holidays










### What's On Local: Maritime Museum

- Lancaster Maritime Museum occupies two historic buildings on St. George's Quay, the heart of the city's 18thcentury harbour. The museum was opened in 1985 in the former Custom House, designed in 1764 by Richard Gillow.
- Open Thursday Monday and free of charge to children and local residents (with proof of address). Children under the age of 16 must be with a responsible adult.







### What's On Local: Lancaster Museum

- The impressive City Museum is housed in Lancaster's former town hall, sat right on the edge of the busy Market Square. The elegant Georgian building was built between 1781-3 to the designs of Major Thomas Jarrett and Thomas Harrison.
- The museum itself was founded in 1923 and its wonderfully varied collection and dioramas brilliantly lead visitors through the social and industrial history, archaeology of Lancaster, and the stories of the people who have made the city what it is today. Enjoy our fine art collection and the programme of changing exhibitions.
- Open Friday Tuesday and free of charge. Children under the age of 16 must be with a responsible adult.
